Content/Objectives

- Models of aging; distinction between normal, “successful”, and pathological aging.
- Physical, social, spiritual, and psychological features of aging and their interaction(s) with disabilities.
- Interactions between biological, social, economic, physical environments and aging.
- Coping and social support issues related to aging and implications for professional practice.
- Ethical issues related to aging and disability; i.e. autonomy, competency, and advanced care directive.
- Social justice issues related to aging and older adults within a context of rehabilitation and disability studies.

Outcomes/Competencies

- to demonstrate a personal and professional understanding of aging and older adults within a context of professional practice,
- to explore the interrelationships and interactions among the biological, social, economic, and physical environments and aging,
- to critically analyze selected issues affecting quality of life for older adults with disabling conditions, and
- to reflect and explore responses to social justice issues from a personal and professional perspective.
