SUMMARY OF TEACHING, RECENT RESEARCH AND INTERNATIONAL PROJECT MANAGEMENT EXPERIENCE

Teaching

Experience with university level instruction began during my doctoral studies in 1964 when I taught off-campus introductory psychology courses. Following graduation a full-time research, professional and administrative career was chosen outside of, but in association with, various universities until 1988. Teaching responsibilities at the several universities have included the following: University of Regina - graduate courses in research design and statistics from 1965 to 1968; the University of Saskatchewan, from 1967 to 1973 - graduate courses on clinical psychology and assessment in the Department of Psychology, and a variety of modules in the Department of Psychiatry's internship program, and the supervision of graduate students at the masters and doctorate levels. At York University in the Faculty of Environmental Studies I co-led a graduate inter-disciplinary studies seminar on human service change from 1983 to '85.

Since joining The University of Calgary in 1988, teaching responsibilities have covered a broad range of content related to psychological and social aspects of community rehabilitation, both at the undergraduate and graduate levels. Courses are taught in Community Rehabilitation and Disability Studies, and previously in Applied Psychology and the Faculty of Social Work. Other teaching experience includes supervision and examination of a sizable number of Master's and Ph.D. level students, and serving as external examiner on a regular basis (details available on request). At present I am supervising Community Rehabilitation and Disability Studies graduate students in Dept of Community Health Sciences, Division of Educational Research and the Interdisciplinary Graduate Program

Recent Research

The core research interest over the past two decades have been towards an understanding and development of a social theory of human services, with emphasis on system change/transition, particularly as impacting on and perceived by marginalized populations, disabled people in particular. My disability and system studies cover a broad spectrum of disability (from cognitive impairment to motor and sensory impairment) and system (from intra-personal systems to highly localized, micro-systems to supra-systems at the world level). Recent publications have examined areas such as the economic integration of disabled persons in Canada; Canada's contributions to the development of policy and program changes internationally related to persons with disabilities since World War II (together with Dr. Henry Enns of the Canadian Centre on Disability Studies, Univ. of Manitoba); and, global changes in employment opportunity for disabled people consequent on a "North/South" strategy being introduced through GLADNET. Recent emphases have been on (1) impact of the new economy on employment of people with disabilities (SSHRC grant); (2) inclusion of people with psychiatric disorders in the workplace; (3) changes in Russia's mental health system resulting from pilot projects being introduced (CIDA funded). The emphasis is on factors affecting or prohibiting inclusion, ranging from the person level to meta-system levels of knowledge and organization.

International Project Management Experience

The various career positions have provided an extensive opportunity to manage projects, both small and large, in Canada and internationally.

International project management experience began during the time I was Director of Canada's National Institute on Mental Retardation (now the Roeher Institute). Together with Allan Roeher, we worked collaboratively with the Caribbean Association on Mental Retardation to develop the Caribbean Institute on Developmental Disabilities (CIDA funded). These substantive experiences plus others led to a variety of international consultations in a sizable number of countries funded through various sources, including 'Save the Children', USAID and CIDA.

Some of the more major project management experiences include the following:

1. Since 1982 there have been a number of projects in the Gaza Strip, beginning with development of a 'Master Plan' which served as a 'blue print' for involvement of the University of Calgary's Rehabilitation and Disability Studies Program, as well as university based programs out of the U.S.A. and Britain, in working with the Palestinian people in developing both educational programs and services related to children and adults with disabilities. On joining the University of Calgary in 1988, I became Co-Director and then Director of three CIDA funded projects which led to the education of 79 students in Gaza with a Bachelor's Degree or post-degree professional Diploma from the University of Calgary. The most recent project, a Diploma with specialization in community rehabilitation of persons with spinal cord and traumatic brain injuries, has just been concluded with a 'continuing education' event in Gaza on recent research and its relevance to practice. Content also has been summarized on CDs which are available both for Gaza participants and for others elsewhere. We have just been asked to assist Palestine with preparation of a cohort of professionals at the Masters' degree level, and to assist with development of their university level teaching capacity.
2. In 1985 I led an evaluation of United Nations affiliated Disabled Peoples' International, a world-wide self-advocacy organization. This involved working with evaluators from Africa (1 from Southern Africa, 1 from West Africa), South America, Central America, the Caribbean and South-east Asia. The final evaluative report required the bringing together of content gathered by researchers in four major languages. A follow-up evaluation was carried out in 1994.
3. From 1991 through 1995 I led an international study of income generation strategies by and for persons with disabilities. With funding support from IDRC, HRDC, the ILO, UN Special Fund and others, this involved managing the work of 15 researchers who collected information from 41 countries (7 high-income, 34 low and middle-income). This included researchers from South Africa, Southern, West and East Africa, as well as all other major world regions.
4. Beginning in October 1997 a project designed to assist in transforming Russia's mental health system has been underway as part of a Canada-Russia partnership (funded through the CIDA and the Gorbachov Fdn). The first phase focused on training 48 mental health professionals, primarily psychiatrists, from nine major centres in Russia. A Phase II project began in the year 2000. It introduced early-stage pilot community mental health projects in seven cities, and trained a second cohort of mental health professionals. It also contributed to the formation of an All-Russia family mental health organization, the first such advocacy and support group in Russia. Starting in 2003, as part of a cross-disability project in collaboration with the Canadian Centre of Disability Studies and the University of Manitoba, a larger development initiative has been undertaken focusing on building capacity of policy makers, professionals and consumers in developing community based and person-centred services in three regions of Russia: North Caucasus (Stavropol), Central (centred in Moscow) and Central Siberia (Omsk).
5. From 2003 through 2005 I served as Monitor and Chief Evaluator of a Tri-lateral Collaboration in the development of Community Based Rehabilitation services in the

Rpublic of Srbsk of Bosnia & Herzigovina. Donor countries were Canada and Japan. The monitoring role involved providing feedback to implementing partners, with the evaluation focused on drawing lessons to be learned about multi-party collaboration in development.

6. From 2002 to the present I have been contracted by Japan's international education funding body to lead an annual leadership development workshop on planning and change with African disability leaders, using a future search conference technique.
