First cohort of participants in Moscow included 41 MH professionals from 21 Russian regions. 17 participants are from 6 demonstration model sites from the 3 Program regions for the Canada-Russia Disability Program, a cross-disability multi-partner initiative designed with the purpose of promoting citizenship development by pursuing the social inclusion of Russians with disabilities and the transformation of key disability related cross-sectoral policies and practices as they affect people with disabilities, including psychiatric disorders. The long-term goal of this program is to contribute to social stability in Russia through a strengthening of

the reform elements, such as civil society and good governance and promoting democratic values, human rights and inclusion of all citizens, particularly people with disabilities. This program is carried out in partnership with the Canadian Centre for Disability Studies – CCDS (lead agency), and the University of Manitoba. The University of Calgary focus is on the area of community mental health, while the other partners are focusing on other disability programs.

2003 – 2005 Co- Director of Trilateral Consortium on Capacity Building in Community Rehabilitation and Disability Studies (CCRDS), 2000-2005. This project is partnered with University of Manitoba and Canadian Center on Disability Studies in Canada; University of Arizona, San Diego State University and Origins Global College in USA; and University of Sonora and the University of North West in Mexico. The consortium focuses on strengthening our social capital through the development of human resources for community rehabilitation and disability study contexts.
